RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. INTRODUCTION

Swiss Netball is immensely grateful to Geneva International Netball (GIN) for developing and running the original GIN Invitational Club League from 2014–2017 and, in 2017, for legating this League to Swiss Netball to further expand it to allow for the participation of all Swiss Netball Clubs.

The division names have been purposefully selected to avoid explicit ordering or numbering, which might suggest that less challenge, effort, determination, competitive spirit or ability were required in one division over another. The Matterhorn is one of the hardest summits in Switzerland to scale, and likely better known. However, even though it is one of the highest at 4,478m, it is not the most elevated. Monte Rosa, at 4,634m, is the highest mountain in Switzerland.

2. ORGANISATION AND ADMINISTRATION

As of 2017, the League has been known as the Swiss Netball League, and as of 2020, shall be re-named the Swiss Netball National League, hereafter referred to as “the League”. The Swiss Netball Committee reserves the right to modify the League name as required, at any time, for marketing purposes and / or to reflect the name of a sponsor.

2.1 League Dates

For the purposes of these rules and regulations and unless otherwise determined by the Swiss Netball Committee, the League shall run annually from 1 September to 30 June of the following year.

2.2 League Divisions

2.2.1 The League will consist of two divisions: **Matterhorn** and **Monte Rosa**. The Swiss Netball Committee reserves the right to modify the League division names as required, at any time, for marketing purposes and / or to reflect the name of a sponsor.

2.2.2 The Matterhorn division will predominantly feature teams with a strong track record of competition wins at Swiss Netball tournaments. Teams featuring three or more current representatives of the Swiss Netball National Squad must play in the Matterhorn division unless the team has ranked bottom of the table and has been subjected to a relegation from the Matterhorn Division.

2.2.3 The Monte Rosa division will be open to all other teams.

2.2.4 This two-division format and number of teams in each division may be modified or renewed subject to annual review.

2.2.5 Subject to the findings of the annual review and the performance of teams at the end of each season’s League, the Swiss Netball Committee retains the right to place teams in divisions for the following season’s League. However, the League will follow the principle of Promotion and Relegation in-between the two divisions.

- i. At the end of each season, the team ranking at the bottom of the table of the Matterhorn division will be moved to the Monte Rosa division for the following season and the team ranking at the top of the Monte Rosa division will be promoted to the Matterhorn division for the following season.
- 2.2.6** If a new team enters the League, they will automatically be assigned to the Monte Rosa division, unless they feature three or more current representatives of the Swiss Netball National Squad.
- 2.3** The League and all rights and properties associated with it shall be owned, controlled and managed by Swiss Netball or through its nominee(s), which may delegate powers and authority in this respect to any sub-committee or individual(s), hereafter known as the Organising Committee.
- 2.4** The decisions of Swiss Netball, or its nominee(s), in respect of these rules and regulations and on any other matter related to the League, which is not provided for below, shall be considered final and binding on all parties.
- 2.5** It is the responsibility of all Netball Club team managers, coaches, captains and officials to ensure that they, and all participants under their responsibility participating in the League, are conversant with these rules and regulations and by entering a team, the Netball Club and its players agree to be bound by them.

3. QUALIFICATIONS AND ENTRY

- 3.1** Entry to the League shall be accepted by any Netball Club which is a Member of Swiss Netball, and which is up to date in the payment of its annual membership fees. Membership fees are due by 31 January each year (Article 14 of the Swiss Netball Statutes). Any Netball Club owing money to Swiss Netball is ineligible to participate in the League until all monies owed have been paid in full.
- 3.2** Entry to the League will be determined by the Swiss Netball Committee or the delegated Organising Committee, at its absolute discretion, subject to its reasonable application of the rules and regulations laid out herein and having due regard to the playing standard of teams which wish to participate.

3.3 Age and Gender Requirements

- 3.3.1** All players must be female and over the age of 16 years as at 23:59 on 31st December immediately prior to the start of the Swiss Netball National League playing season. All players should carry proof of age to be shown upon request.
- 3.3.2** It is the responsibility of the player's Head Coach to determine that all players demonstrate the physical, emotional, social and technical ability as well as maturity to compete in a Senior Competition.
- 3.3.3** For any athlete under the age of 18 years, the player's Head Coach must complete and return to the League Organiser the Swiss Netball Age Banding Waiver Form (attached) before the player is eligible to compete in the League. By completing this form, the Head Coach is determining that this player is suitable to play in the League.

3.4 League Invitations

- 3.4.1** In the spirit of supporting the development of netball across Swiss borders, the Swiss Netball Committee may extend an invitation to Netball Clubs across Swiss borders who are not participating in their own country's National League. Invitations will not be extended automatically, but on a case-by-case basis following each annual review and subject to availability. In this instance, the participating Netball Club(s)

will need to be a Member of Swiss Netball (see **3.1** above) and subjected to all current rules and regulations, including registered player Individual Membership (see **3.5.1**).

3.5 Individual Membership

- 3.5.1** Each registered player must be an Individual Member of Swiss Netball and must have paid the prescribed membership fee.
- 3.5.2** Any player joining the League part way through the season must have paid the prescribed Swiss Netball Individual Membership fee 48 hours prior to the commencement of their first League match.
- 3.5.3** Any individual owing money to Swiss Netball is ineligible to participate in the League until all monies owed have been paid in full.
- 3.5.4** It shall be the responsibility of the participating Netball Club to ensure that each player on its registration team sheet is an individual member of Swiss Netball and as such, is registered as a member of the relevant Netball Club. If any player who participates in the event is not a member of Swiss Netball, the Netball Club will be fined a penalty fee of CHF 100.- payable within 7 days of the match. In addition, proof of individual membership must be submitted to Swiss Netball within 7 days. Failure to pay the individual membership fee and the penalty fee within 7 days will result in the match being forfeited. Failure to pay the penalty fee within 7 days may also result in disqualification from the League.

3.6 Entry Fees

Swiss Netball is entitled to charge an entry fee to the League. League entry fees for all teams entered by a Netball Club must be paid to Swiss Netball no later than 72 hours before that Club's first match of the season.

- 3.7** By entering a team in the League, Netball Clubs agree they will abide by these rules and regulations and that they are able and willing to fulfil the costs and commitments of participation in the League.

3.8 Squad Registration

- 3.8.1** All participating Netball Clubs are required to submit a list of the names of players affiliated to their Netball Club for each team wishing to play in the League and their year of birth at the time of team registration. There is no limit to the number of players a Club can register.
- 3.8.2** Only registered players on the squad team list may play in the League. Proof of affiliation can be requested at any time and all players are expected to be affiliated to their stated Netball Club as an Individual Member.
- 3.8.3** Additional players can be added to the squad team list during the year by registering a player at least 7 days in advance of the next scheduled match. Any new player will be required to be an Individual Member of Swiss Netball (see **3.5.2** above) and affiliated to their stated Netball Club (see 3.8 above).
- 3.8.4** Netball Clubs may enter multiple teams in the League, and players are only allowed to play for their registered team during the year. There will be no allowance for a player(s) from one squad team registration list to play for another team. If a team is unable to field and start the match with 5 players, the match will be forfeited by that team.

- 3.8.5** Players in a higher division cannot play in a lower division match. However, players in a lower division can be borrowed for a team in the higher division. If the player is borrowed twice, they will move to the team in the higher division.
- 3.8.6** If a team is reduced to 7 players or less through illness or injury supported by a medical certificate or under extreme circumstances (this will need to be demonstrated) a team may use one or more (as needed) of their registered Club squad players. Confirmation in writing (email is the preferred method) is to be sent to operations@swissnetball.ch together with supporting documentation. The Swiss Netball Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of entries in future years should it be deemed that the number of League entries exceeds capacity
- 3.8.7** Netball Clubs may only register up to twelve (12) players per team for each match entered and only players affiliated to a Netball Club can play for that team. The names of the twelve (12) players must appear on the relevant team registration sheet for each match which must be submitted to operations@swissnetball.ch 7 days in advance of the League match dates.

3.9 Transfer of Players

- 3.9.1** The two clubs involved in the transfer of player must confirm any transfer through writing via email to admin@swissnetball.ch. However, the player may only play for the new club if she has not played any League match for the previous club during the season.
- 3.9.2.** The player must be added to the squad team list at least 7days in advance to the next schedule match as per **3.8.3** above.
- 3.10** Swiss Netball recommends that pregnant individuals (players, umpires, officials, team managers and coaches) should only participate with approval from their doctor. Players, umpires, officials, team managers and coaches participating in the League when pregnant will be deemed to have consented to any risks (including any risk of injury to the participant and / or the unborn child) that may arise from such participation. Aside from liability for death or personal injury resulting from negligence, the individual will also be deemed to have waived any and all claims, causes and rights of action against Swiss Netball, the Organising Committee, event organisers, players and match officials, whether at law or in equity, of whatever nature and in any jurisdiction or forum, that she may have as a result of such participation. Swiss Netball observes the World Netball Pregnancy Guidelines and strongly recommends that all pregnant participants take note of these guidelines and follow the advice provided.
- 3.11** Swiss Netball will be responsible to provide a first aider for all League matches.
- 3.12** Netball Club officials will be held responsible for the Overall Conduct* (behaviour, demeanour and actions) of all members associated with the Club, including players, associated officials, volunteers and spectators. Netball Clubs are responsible for ensuring that all of their players, associated officials, volunteers and spectators have all been made aware of and adhere to the Swiss Netball Codes of Conduct attached to these regulations.

4. FIXTURE ARRANGEMENTS

- 4.1** Swiss Netball will provide League match dates as published on the Swiss Netball calendar. They are responsible for arranging match venues and any costs associated for court hire. Each round of the League will be played on the same day at the same venue.

- 4.2 Matches will be played wherever possible on a court with appropriate surrounds and surface and with ancillary facilities for participants, including changing and showering facilities for teams and officials.
- 4.3 Each team will play each of the other teams in their division twice.
- 4.4 It is the responsibility of Swiss Netball to conduct a risk assessment for each venue in advance.
- 4.5 Teams are responsible for arranging their own travel to matches, at their own expense, and should allow sufficient travelling time to cover any unexpected delays.

5. MATCH REGULATIONS

5.1 All matches shall be played to the World Netball Rules of the Game currently in force at the time, except where specific League rules and regulations may apply: <https://netball.sport/game/the-rules-of-netball>

5.2 No team may start a game with less than five players. If a team cannot field at least five players, it will forfeit the match (see 6.2). For the avoidance of doubt, if it is clear to the Swiss Netball Committee representative that a team has been unable, by the end of the league round to field 5 players to play a match in accordance with this regulation, that team will be deemed to have forfeited.

5.3 There will be no allowance for re-scheduling of matches. If a team is unable to take the court at the scheduled time for any reason, the match will be deemed to have been forfeited by that team (see 6.2).

5.4 Match Timings

5.4.1 Matches will consist of four quarters, each quarter of fifteen minutes, and there will be an interval of four minutes between the first-second and third-fourth quarters, and a half-time interval of eight minutes.

5.4.2 A technical official will signal the commencement of timing as well as the end of each quarter to the umpires.

5.5 Match Stoppages

5.5.1 In extreme circumstances and in consultation with the Swiss Netball Committee representative, the umpire may decide to abandon a match, for example, following a serious injury, if the safety of players and / or officials is considered to be at risk. In this instance, Swiss Netball would allow this match to be re-played at a later date. Swiss Netball accepts most netball injuries i.e. knee, ankle, etc., fall outside this exemption clause.

5.5.2 An Accident / Incident Report must be duly completed by the team concerned for any accident or incident, on or off the court, using the Accident / Incident Report form annexed to this document. A copy shall be provided to the Swiss Netball Committee along with the team registration and scorecard within 3 days of the match. This procedure will be followed for all injuries and accidents, regardless of whether or not medical treatment is given immediately after the end of the match and send via email to operations@swissnetball.ch or text +41.76.668.3051.

5.5.3 If a player is suspended from a match or ordered to leave the court and take no further part in the match, that player and her coach / captain will be required to file an incident report (annexed) immediately after the end of the match and send via email to operations@swissnetball.ch or text +41.76.668.3051.

5.5.4 In the event of a player suspension, or if a player is ordered to leave the court and take no further part in the match, both umpires are required to complete the Player Suspension and Sending Off Report form (annexed) immediately after the end of the match and send via email to operations@swissnetball.ch or text +41.76.668.3051.

5.6 Balls and Bibs

5.6.1 Swiss Netball will provide at least two size five (5) netballs for the match.

5.6.2 All players must wear positional bibs and teams must have a spare set in a different colour in case of a clash of colours.

5.6.3 In the event of a clash of colours, a toss of coin between two captains will decide which team retains their original colours.

5.7 Players are reminded that they may not wear anything that could endanger themselves or other players. Before the start of each match, captains must ensure that all of their players have removed all jewellery, including friendship bands on wrists and ankles, and all earrings and studs on any part of the body (entire ear, nose, etc.). Without exception no taping of ears is accepted.

6. LEAGUE SCORING

6.1 The League competition tables will be compiled based on points awarded to each team as follows:

- 5 points for a win
- 3 points for a draw
- 2 points if within 5 goals of the winner's score, (i.e., 2 points will be awarded for a result of 25–21, whereas 1 point will be awarded for a result of 25–20)
- 1 point for scoring more than 50 per cent of the winner's score
- 0 points for 50 per cent goals or less of the winner's score

6.2 Should a team have to forfeit a match, this will be recorded as a loss with 0 points awarded. The opposing team will be awarded a 15-0 win and 5 points.

6.3 To determine the winners of the League divisions where two or more teams are level on points:

6.3.1 Goal average (goals for divided by goals against) shall be used to determine their relative positions, i.e., the team with the higher average score over the course of the competition stage shall take precedence.

6.3.2 In the event that goal average does not differentiate between the teams, then goal difference shall be applied, i.e., precedence shall be given to the team with the greater difference between goals scored and goals conceded.

6.3.3 In the event that the goal difference does not differentiate between the teams, then the team with the greatest number of goals scored shall take precedence.

6.3.4 In the event that neither goal average nor goal difference nor goals scored can differentiate between the teams; aggregate score in the previous matches between the two teams will determine the winner; if the winner is still undetermined, away goals of their two matches will count as double points. If still undetermined the two teams will share the title of winner of that League division for the relevant year.

- 6.3.4.1** In the event two teams have equal points at the bottom of the Matterhorn division or the top of the Monte Rosa division, a play-off match between those teams will determine who is moved up or down.
- 6.3.5** Where one of the teams has its goal average, goal difference or total number of goals scored affected by conceded fixtures, then all goals scored by and against conceding team(s) in all fixtures shall be omitted from the calculations of the team's level on points. For example, if one team received 5 points for a conceded fixture, then the goals scored by and against all teams' level on points, in all games against the offending team, will not be included when its goal average, goal difference or total number of goals is calculated.

7. REGISTRATION OF RESULTS

- 7.1** Both participating teams in a match are required to complete one official Swiss Netball score sheet (annexed) at the end of their match, using the team registration and score sheet template available from the Swiss Netball Committee.
- 7.2** The Swiss Netball score sheet for each match must be checked and signed by both technical officials, both Netball Club coaches and both umpires. Once the official score sheet has been signed no dispute can be logged.
 - 7.2.1** In the event of any discrepancy where the technical officials, umpires and teams cannot agree on the score, both teams will forfeit the match and no points will be awarded and 15 goals against will be registered to both teams.
- 7.3** The duly completed score sheet must be submitted to the Swiss Netball Committee representative by each team at the end of the match.

8 MATCH OFFICIALS AND TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

8.1 Match Officials

- 8.1.1** The Match Officials are the umpires.
- 8.1.2** A minimum of two umpires holding the Europe Netball C Award, or above, will be required to officiate each match. Each team must provide at least one umpire from their own Netball Club or should arrange for an umpire from another Netball Club to support their match(es).
- 8.1.3** Umpires should be non-playing and umpire arrangements must be made in advance.
- 8.1.4** In the event that an umpire fails to arrive, or is injured or taken ill during a match, the following procedure will be applied: if another umpire of the appropriate standard is available then they may umpire the match. Failing that, the next best-qualified umpire may be used. If the two teams cannot agree on an alternative, the team with no umpire will forfeit the match and this will be recorded as a loss. The opposing team will be awarded a win according to **6.2**. However, if this opposing team wishes to instead reschedule the match without penalizing the other team (with no umpire) then they may do so.

8.2 Technical Officials

- 8.2.1** The Technical Officials are the scorers and timekeepers.
- 8.2.2** Two scorers and one timekeeper will be required for each match.
- 8.2.3** Each team entered must provide one competent scorer and timekeeper. The role of the timekeeper will be decided by a toss of coin or verbal agreement between the two timekeepers prior to the start of the match. Technical officials should be non-playing and arrangements must be made in advance.
- 8.2.4** The two technical officials will stand and work together opposite the centre of the court to score and time the match.

9. LEAGUE COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE

- 9.1** Where the complaint relates to the competition format or management, including (but not limited to) the schedule, the opposing team, playing surface or other playing arrangements, a complaint must be lodged in writing (email is the preferred method), before the start of the match (or as soon as possible after the issue becomes apparent during the match) to the Swiss Netball Committee by the relevant team or Match Official. The complaint must be then acknowledged by the Swiss Netball Committee who will decide what action should be taken.
- 9.2** Where the complaint relates to the playing of a match, the scoring, and / or its result, the relevant team or match official, must do the following:
- 9.2.1** Inform the opponents and the umpires of their complaint.
- 9.2.2** Mark the scorecard with the words "Under Protest".
- 9.2.3** Submit the marked scorecard to operations@swissnetball.ch and admin@swissnetball.ch straight after the match.
- 9.2.4** Explain the issue in full in writing (email is the preferred method), within 24 hours following the event being complained about to the Swiss Netball Committee at admin@swissnetball.ch who will decide what action should be taken.
- 9.3** Where the complaint relates to any of the matters described in regulation **9.3.2** which have not already been the subject of a decision under regulation **9.1**, the complaint shall be dealt with as set out below.
- 9.3.1.** A person may lodge a complaint concerning:
- i. a participant at the League match (including a player, match official, technical official, coach, team official or Swiss Netball Committee)
 - ii. a supporter or other person attending the League match
 - iii. a team as a whole; or
 - iv. the governance or administration of the League.
- 9.3.2** The subject of the complaint may be one or more of the following:
- i. Breaches of the Code of Conduct including verbal or physical abuse, assault, threatening behaviour or harassment by a member or a supporter.
 - ii. Standard of umpiring or timekeeping.
 - iii. Non-members playing a game.
 - iv. Breaches of Swiss Netball's Statutes; or
 - v. Any other conduct or incident which the Competition referee considers may be subject to a complaint.
- 9.3.3** A complaint may be lodged by making the complaint in writing (email is the preferred method) within 24 hours after the event being complained about.
- 9.3.4** The complaint must be then acknowledged by the Swiss Netball Committee who will decide what action, if any, should be taken.
- 9.4** The Swiss Netball Committee decision in relation to decisions taken under regulation 9. is binding.

9.5 Complaints received by Swiss Netball under this regulation 9. will be dealt with by the Swiss Netball Committee in accordance with the processes set out in the Swiss Netball Statutes.

10. LEAGUE CONTACTS

10.1 Participating teams should send all necessary documentation (team registration and scorecard form, accident / incident form, League age band consent form for approval, etc.) to operations@swissnetball.ch.

10.2 Netball Clubs must provide their full contact details to the Swiss Netball Committee, including a postal address, email and contact telephone number(s) to facilitate the organisation of the League.

11. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISOS

11.1 All participants acknowledge that participating in the sport of netball involves a risk of personal injury. When taking part in the League, each player, team member, team official, other official or spectator, participates at her or his own risk and must hold personal accident, health and personal liability insurances. Swiss Netball does not accept any liability for accidents and / or injury that may occur. It is the responsibility of relevant Netball Clubs participating in a match to ensure that any damage to property is insured.

11.2 If any of these regulations are held by any competent authority to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the regulations shall not be affected thereby.

11.3 These regulations shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with Swiss law.

11.4 Any questions regarding these regulations can be addressed to admin@swissnetball.ch.

11.5 Swiss Netball reserves the right to amend these regulations each year in advance of the start of the League.



Code of Conduct for Players (Players, Coaches, Match Officials)

Representing your Netball Club in the Swiss Netball National League is a privilege and requires a serious commitment to netball. You are expected to:

- Know and play by the rules.
- Participate fairly and safely.
- Be respectful to fellow players, coaches, officials, spectators and volunteers.
- Respect the decisions of umpires and coaches.
- Behave in a responsible manner relating to language, temper and punctuality.
- Wear appropriate kit.
- Inform your coach of any injury or medical condition which may affect your performance.
- Maintain a high standard of personal behaviour at all times and adhere to guidelines and rules applied to the events you attend.
- Represent Swiss Netball positively on social media and in other communications and not use social media or other communications to bring the game into disrepute or make an inappropriate comment about a fellow athlete, coach, official, volunteer or the governing body.
- Abide by the anti-doping rules in conformity with the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) code and not engage in practices that affect sporting performance (alcohol, tobacco and drug use). Please refer to the WADA prohibited list: [WADA prohibited list](#)



Code of Conduct for Swiss Netball Supporters

Swiss Netball welcomes and greatly appreciates the support of the parents, carers, families and friends who attend Swiss Netball League matches:

- Recognising that we all have a responsibility to uphold the highest standards of good sportsmanship in netball, and to positively support the players, coaches, officials and Lead by example and show respect for all players, coaches, umpires, administrators and spectators.
- Respect the decision of the coaches, including in match selection.
- Accept the officials' and umpires' decision without comment.
- Always use appropriate language.
- Support players to uphold the Code of Conduct for Players.
- Discourage criticism or ridiculing of any player's performance, both during and after the game.
- Respect the facilities and equipment.
- Do not use social media technology to bring the game into disrepute or make an inappropriate comment about a player, coach, official, volunteer or the governing bodies. Please also note that, in line with the Cool & Clean policy adopted by Swiss Netball, smoking is not permitted at training, competition or associated events.

How to score Odds and Evens game

- Once the *coin toss* has been taken by the team captains before the game begins and the team taking the first Centre Pass has been decided:
 - Enter 'E' for EVENS in the 1st Quarter Centre Pass box to the team who is taking the first centre pass
 - Enter 'O' for ODDS in the 1st Quarter Centre Pass box to the opposing team
- Once play begins, strike out the existing number after a team scores a goal. At the end of each quarter circle the current score and enter into the relevant quarter box.
- To calculate which team should take the next centre pass, add the scores together e.g., 5 + 9 = 14 which is an even number so the next centre pass would go to the 'EVENS' team.
- Enter an 'E' or 'O' for the appropriate team with the first centre pass at the start of each of the 2nd, 3rd and 4th quarters (leaving the opposing team box blank). Visually check with the umpires to confirm the correct centre pass is indicated / being taken at the beginning of each quarter.
